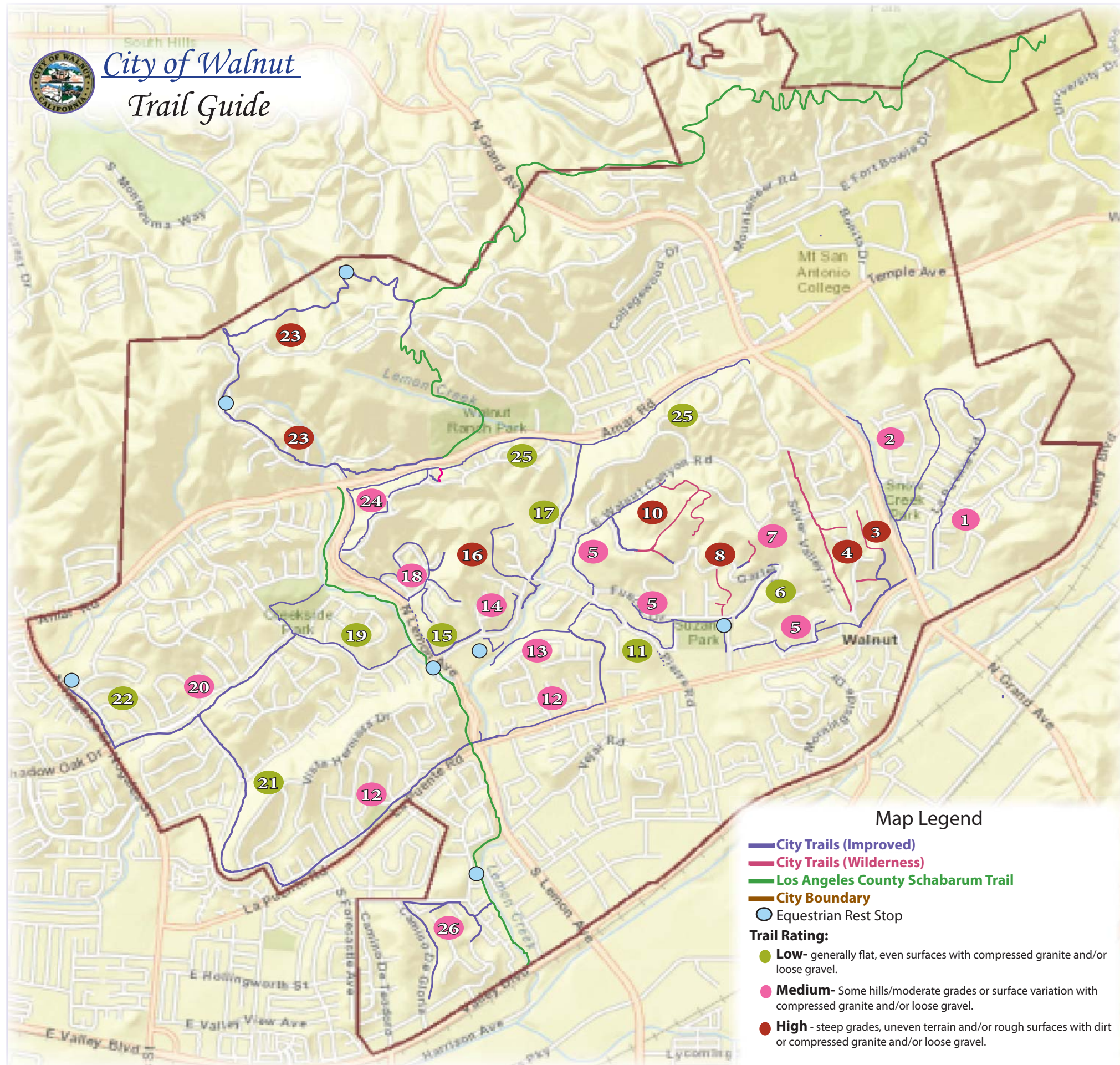




City of Walnut Trail Guide



There are 30 miles of equestrian/hiking trails winding through Walnut's rolling hills. The scenic, natural topography provides an ideal place for walking, hiking or equestrian riding. This map shows trails, both improved and wilderness, within the City of Walnut, including a segment of the LA County Schabarum Trail. The Map Legend indicates the location of equestrian rest stops and describes the rating system of the trails.

Trail Number/Rating and Access Points

- 1 Trail runs along La Puente Rd. and then along a segment of Snow Creek in the Snow Creek development.
- 2 Trail runs north along east side of Grand Ave. from La Puente Rd. ending across the street from Stoneybrook Dr.).
- 3 Wilderness trail with access points are near intersection of Spur Trail Ave. & La Puente Rd. or Grand Ave. & La Puente Rd.
- 4 Wilderness trail. Access points on the following streets: Spur Trail Ave., Snow Creek Dr., and Stoneybrook Dr.
- 5 Trail begins at Cofer Ct., goes west along Benik Pl. to Gartel Dr (north), then along Marcon Dr to Suzanne Rd. (north) to Fuerte Dr. (west) and then to Walnut Canyon Rd. (north).
- 6 Trail runs north along Fuerte Dr. from the intersection of Fuerte Dr. and Suzanne Rd.
- 7 Trail accessed on Gartel Dr. west of the intersection of Gartel Dr./ Fuerte Dr. The last segment is a wilderness trail.
- 8 Wilderness trail access off Fuerte Dr. east of Bridle Trail Rd.
- 10 Trail access points off Monica Way and off Walnut Canyon Dr.
- 11 Trail runs along the north and west sides of Suzanne Park, continues north on Pierre Rd.
- 12 Trail runs east from intersection of La Puente Rd. and Paseo de Caballo then north (east of Lone Eagle Rd.). Meets Trail 13.
- 13 Trail runs between Meadowpass Rd. and Peirre Rd. Access points: Meadowpass Rd. or Peirre Rd.
- 14 Trail runs along Meadowpass Rd. between Colt Ln. and Tennessee Tr. Two access points: Colt Ln and Tennessee Tr.
- 15 Trail has two access points: Meadowpass Rd. & Lemon Ave. and Meadowpass Rd. & Colt Ln.
- 16 Trail runs on south side of Meadowpass Rd. (100 yards) then north as a wilderness trail.
- 17 Trail runs along Meadowpass Rd. between Amar Rd. and Sunny Glen Rd./Pierre Rd.
- 18 Trail runs along residential homes near the intersection of Hunters Hill Ln. and Lemon Ave.
- 19 Trail runs on Creekside Dr. from Lemon Ave. into Creekside Park (east), then meets the Schabarum Trail (on Lemon Ave.)
- 20 Trail runs on Shadow Oak Dr. (Creekside Park - Nogales St.)
- 21 Trail south from Shadow Oak Dr. along Beverly Dr.
- 22 Trail runs north on Nogales St. (Shadow Oak Dr. - Sutter Ck.)
- 23 Trail runs along Lemon Ave. north of Amar Rd. and then along the ridgelines. Connects to the Schabarum Trail.
- 24 Trail begins at intersection of Lemon Ave. and Saddlecrest Dr. goes north to Amar Rd., east to Countryside Dr. and then circles back south to Lemon Ave.
- 25 Trail runs along the southern side of Amar Rd. between Lemon Ave. and Regal Canyon Dr.
- 26 Trail runs along Camino De Gloria, Calle Baja. Connects to the Schabarum Trail north of Valley Blvd.

- Trail Rating:**
- **Low**- generally flat, even surfaces with compressed granite and/or loose gravel.
 - **Medium**- Some hills/moderate grades or surface variation with compressed granite and/or loose gravel.
 - **High** - steep grades, uneven terrain and/or rough surfaces with dirt or compressed granite and/or loose gravel.
