6. Resolution No. 22-08 – A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Walnut confirming the appointment of Tom Weiner as City Manager and approving an Employment Agreement

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 22-08, "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Walnut confirming the appointment of Tom Weiner as City Manager and approving an Employment Agreement.

CA/Leibold presented a staff report and summarized the following clerical corrections and revisions from closed session as follows: In Section 1 under "Term," the following sentence will be added – "provided this agreement has not been previously terminated and unless notice of termination or notice of non-renewal is given by the City pursuant to section 8a at least six months before the expiration of the term or any extension thereof, this agreement shall automatically extend for an additional six months from the anniversary of the expiration date. In

Section 3a under "Salary," the salary will be changed from \$200,000 to \$204,000. In Section 4b under "Retirement," the City will pay five percent and the employee will pay two percent of the seven percent of the employee share in PERS.

M/Ching opened public comment.

William Harrison stated that he feels that the current city manager should at least be making what the outgoing city manager received.

7. Approval of Plans and Specifications and Agreement for Vendor Services with Public Restroom Company for \$440,023 to Purchase and Install a Park Restroom and Utility Building for the Diversity Plaza - Creekside Park Project and Appropriation of \$210,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds

Recommendation:

- 1. Authorize the City Engineer to review and approve the final plans and specifications for the modular park restroom and utility building to be part of the Diversity Plaza Project at Creekside Park.
- 2. Appropriate \$210,000 from ARPA Fund Reserves to the Diversity Plaza-Creekside Park Project for the cost of the expanded restroom portion of the building.
- 3. Approve the Agreement for Vendor Services with Public Restroom Company in the amount of \$440,023 for the purchase and installation of restroom and utility building at Creekside Park; and
- 4. Authorize the City Manager to sign the contract on behalf of the City in substantially the form attached and in such final form as approved by the City Attorney; and
- 5. Authorize staff to issue a Purchase Order to Public Restroom Company in the amount of \$440,023; and
- 6. Determine that the Diversity Plaza Project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (Cal. Publ. Res. Code §§21000 et seq. "CEQA") and the State CEQA Guidelines (14. Cal. Code Regs §§15000 et seq.) pursuant to Section 15003 Class 3 Exemption in that the project

consists of the installation of (a) a single new small restroom and storage facility (b) a small picnic shelter, and (c) a new spray play area in an existing park involving negligible or no expansion of use and/or is required for public health and safety, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk.

CSS/Barcelo presented a staff report.

Discussion took place between Council and staff regarding specifics of the project, project funding, and the history of the project.

M/Ching opened public comment.

William Harrison thanked Council and staff for their efforts on the project.
