RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission receive and file the Parks and Maintenance Report for March 2022.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the current status of the maintenance and operations of the City of Walnut's Park system.

The Maintenance Division of the Community Services Department manages general park maintenance at all City parks. General maintenance is performed largely by a landscape maintenance contractor and some by the City staff. The general maintenance includes mowing, edging, hedging, pruning of shrubs and trees, as well as the monitoring of rodents and pests. It also includes irrigation audits and playground inspections. Restroom maintenance services are provided by the custodial contractor. Park restrooms are open and maintained seven days a week, with the exception of two holidays per year (Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

City parks with sports fields are maintained at an optimum level through the services of sports field specialists. City staff augments the maintenance services through regular inspections and audits of the fields.

City maintenance staff also performs special projects in all parks including graffiti removal and playground equipment repairs. In order to conform to California playground standards, staff performs playground inspections on a weekly basis.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the Recreation Programs that occurred during the month of February.

SENIOR PROGRAMS:

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health modified their Health Order to lift the mandate of indoor masking. It is still "strongly recommended" to wear a mask, but not required, regardless of vaccination status. Staff and program participants at the Senior Center and other City facilities now have option to wear masks indoors.

SENIOR CURBSIDE/HOME DELIVERED NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

Staff continues to coordinate the County Nutrition Program for older adults, which had been a congregate meal program at the Walnut Senior Center. The program is now operated as a hybrid pick-up/home delivery programs. Those residents who cannot leave their home continue to receive home delivered meals, while others are scheduled for drive-through (no contact) pick up. Los Angeles County has extended the curbside service to continue through 2022 until further notice.

MT. SAC OLDER ADULT CLASSES:

The spring session of classes began on Tuesday, February 22 and will continue through to June 17. Class registrations are currently overseen by Mt. SAC's Older Adult Programs with caps on total number for each class (set by the City) based on facility protocols.

WEEKLY ACTIVITIES:

The Walnut Senior Center have continued to keep their doors open to the public welcoming back a few of the social groups including Mahjong, Bridge, Billiards and Tole Painting. All social groups have designated meeting times with the exception of Billiards, which is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.

TEEN CENTER:

The Teen Center is open for the 2021-22 school year, regular hours are Monday through Friday from 2:00 pm to 7:00 pm and Thursdays from 12:30 to 7:00 pm for Suzanne's early dismissal days. Teens in 6th through 12th grade enjoy activities including sports, crafts, movies, board games and snacks. Teens also have access to various textbooks and computers to complete their schoolwork between the hours of 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday through Thursday. On Fridays, the Teen Center hosts Film Fridays between the hours of 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm where teens are shown a movie on the projector screen. Parents have the option of purchasing the entire school year for \$100 or by semester for \$55 per semester.

The outdoor area in front of the Teen Center has been equipped with tables and chairs for teens who wish to eat a snack (eating inside is currently not permitted).

There are currently 272 registered members of the Walnut Teen Center.

Every Tuesday in the month of March the Teen Center hosted Special Treat Tuesdays where we sold shamrock cupcakes, rainbow snow cones, rainbow sherbet, and leprechaun punch. The prices for all treats were \$1.00 each.

The Youth and Family Group Counseling program is conducted every Monday at 6:00 pm at the Walnut Senior Center.

SPORTS LEAGUES & CLASSES:

Open Gym hours for Table Tennis, Badminton, and Basketball are available in the morning from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Walnut Gymnasium. Limited-capacity, and all LACDPH protocols are being abided by. On Tuesday, March 29 Volleyball was added to the open gym schedule from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm; on the first day there were 35 new gym memberships sold.

Walnut Youth Basketball (WYB) season ended on March 5 after the season was pushed back due to COVID-19. WYB hosted a total of 22 teams ranging from grades K through 8th. As the season was nearing the end, WYB participants who were interested and qualified were able to participate in the SCMAF SGV Basketball Skills Competition that was held on March 19th in Walnut. Players went through a timed set challenge that includes dribbling, and shooting and were able to play with players from other cities.

Uptempo Basketball holds a number of classes including Little Dribblers, Skills Clinic, Advanced Dribbling Clinic and an Elite Clinic class. Classes range from beginner to experience skill set for children ranging in ages of 4 to 18 years of age.

The pickle ball, six month pilot program on Tuesdays and Thursdays debuted at Walnut Ranch Park on January 11. Staff has been monitoring the use of play, hosting community meet ups, and conducting clinics for anyone who wants to learn the game of pickle ball. There has been growing popularity from 4 people showing up to 28 people playing, most of whom, are Walnut residents. The V.I.P. (Very Important Pickleballer) Tournament was held on March 24th from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm, 11 pickleballers participated in a round robin style of play where each participant partnered with each other and the individual who had the most wins has championed as the V.I.P. Staff is preparing for another tournament in April.

SENIOR/COMMUNITY EXCURSIONS:

Spring registration for the 2022 season opened on February 14 for residents. Due to uncertainty created by the global pandemic, staff continuous to take a cautious approach to booking excursions. Capacity for trips has increased to 70% and continues to meet the busing company and venue guidelines. Masking is required on the bus and any indoor location (optional outdoors).
