RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission receive and file the Parks and Maintenance Report for November and December 2022.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the current status of the maintenance and operations of the City of Walnut's Park system.

The Maintenance Division of the Community Services Department manages general park maintenance at all City parks. General maintenance is performed largely by a landscape maintenance contractor and some by the City staff. The general maintenance includes mowing, edging, hedging, pruning of shrubs and trees, as well as the monitoring of rodents and pests. It also includes irrigation audits and playground inspections. Restroom maintenance services are provided by the custodial contractor. Park restrooms are open and maintained seven days a week, with the exception of two holidays per year (Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

City parks with sports fields are maintained at an optimum level through the services of sports field specialists. City staff augments the maintenance services through regular inspections and audits of the fields.

City maintenance staff also performs special projects in all parks including graffiti removal and playground equipment repairs. In order to conform to California playground standards, staff performs playground inspections on a weekly basis.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the Recreation Programs that occurred during the months of November and December.

SENIOR PROGRAMS:

SENIOR CURBSIDE NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

Staff continues to coordinate the County Nutrition Program for older adults, which had been a congregate meal program at the Walnut Senior Center. The Grab and Go program continues to operate as a curbside pick-up on Thursdays for those who are able to pick-up their meals. Those residents who cannot leave their home continue to receive home delivered meals through YWCA. Los Angeles County has extended the curbside service to continue until further notice. We are currently serving 167 seniors.

SENIOR DINE-IN NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

Since June 2022, Los Angeles County has reinstated the Senior Dine-In Nutrition Lunch program. The Dine-In program is open to older adults aged 60 years and older. Currently, we are serving hot meals Monday through Wednesday on a first-come first-serve basis. To

participate, guest must complete an intake form, check-in opens at 10:30 am with meals served from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm or until food is available.

OLDER ADULT CLASSES:

Heart and Soul Line Dance classes have been in full swing offering lessons twice a week. Monday classes are perfect for the working older adult and scheduled for 6pm. Thursday classes are perfect for the retired person, scheduled for the morning at 9:30 am. These classes are a perfect way to good heart health without the constant strain on joints and easy to follow. All levels are welcome and no partners necessary.

TEEN CENTER:

Teens in 6th through 12th grades are able to enjoy activities including sports, crafts, board games, movies, air hockey, table tennis, foosball and pool. Homework assistance is available to those who wish. To date, we have over 300 participants enrolled in the Teen Center.

The Youth and Family Group Counseling program is conducted every Monday at 6:00 pm at the Walnut Senior Center.

In November 2022, The Teen Center offered Special Treats every Tuesday which included: Hot Chocolate, fall Sugar cookies, and S'mores Rice Krispy treats. The December Special Treats were Melted Snowman Punch and a delicious Hot Chocolate Bar where teens could make the most over the top hot chocolate.

The Teen Center also hosted a fun Thanksgiving game of hiding the Turkeys on Thursday, November 17.

SPORTS LEAGUES & CLASSES:

Open Gym hours for Table Tennis, Badminton, and Basketball are available in the morning from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Walnut Gymnasium and volleyball on Tuesdays from 7:00 pm to 10:30 pm.

Walnut Youth Basketball (WYB) fall season started practices on November 7th in preparation for the team's first games scheduled for December 17. The season will run through March 4, 2023 with games every Saturday. This season we will have 24 teams with the new addition to a Girls only team for Division 2 (3rd/4th). The WYB season is for children in grades K thru 8th.

The Adult Basketball League (ABL) began its fall season concluded in December with 16 teams participating on Wednesday night and Thursday night. Each night those 16 teams are separated into two divisions of 8 teams. Staff is planning for the Winter/Spring League that will start the end of January.

Uptempo Basketball Academy held a three day Thanksgiving Camp November 21 -23, 2023 and hosted 59 youth ages 5 to 14 years old. In December they hosted a one day camp on December 16, 2023 for 22 participants and a four (4) day camp December 19-22 for 57 participants. Participants did various drills working on dribbling, shooting, defense, offense and game play each day of all the camps.

The extended pickleball pilot program is taking place until the end of the calendar year to allow for City staff to look into options for a permanent court. The court at Walnut Ranch is slated for pickleball play seven days a week. Staff has been seeing more consistency on the weekends with community members learning and playing pick-up games of pickleball.

The new Pickleball Flex League continued in November and will conclude in December. This league allows for teams to schedule matches that are convenient for all players. There are a total of 8 matches that consist of 3 sets played to 15 points and must win by 2 points. Once the match is over; scores are reported and recorded by scanning a QR code for staff to manage the league standings.

Winter Jam was held on Saturday, December 10 from 5:00pm to 9:00pm at Suzanne Park. The event was a success with more than 1100+ people in attendance. Featured live music by Filosophy and Cold Duck creating a party-like environment for dancing under the stars. The winter wonderland area featured a snow play area, sled rides, arts and crafts, game booths, and a photo opportunity with Santa.

Community Holiday Dinner and Dance

On Friday, December 16, the Senior Center held its annual Community Holiday Dinner and Dance. The community was treated to delicious food and live entertainment. Catering services were provided by Tiscarenos Catering and live entertainment from Chico Band. A total of 140

participants were in attendance and all enjoyed the holiday festivities. This event was sold out weeks before the scheduled date.
