RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the current status of the maintenance and operations of the City of Walnut's Park system.

The Maintenance Division of the Community Services Department manages general park maintenance at all City parks. General maintenance is performed largely by a landscape maintenance contractor and some by the City staff. The general maintenance includes mowing, edging, hedging, pruning of shrubs and trees, as well as the monitoring of rodents and pests. It also includes irrigation audits and playground inspections. Restroom maintenance services are provided by the custodial contractor. Park restrooms are open and maintained seven days a week, with the exception of two holidays per year (Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

City parks with sports fields are maintained at an optimum level through the services of sports field specialists. City staff augments the maintenance services through regular inspections and audits of the fields.

City maintenance staff also performs special projects in all parks including graffiti removal and playground equipment repairs. In order to conform to California playground standards, staff performs playground inspections on a weekly basis.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the Recreation Programs that occurred during the month of January.

SENIOR PROGRAMS:

SENIOR CURBSIDE NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

Staff continues to coordinate the County Nutrition Program for older adults, which had been a congregate meal program at the Walnut Senior Center. The Grab and Go program continues to operate as a curbside pick-up on Thursdays for those who are able to pick-up their meals. Those residents who cannot leave their home continue to receive home delivered meals through YWCA. Los Angeles County has extended the curbside service to continue until further notice. We are currently serving 167 seniors.

SENIOR DINE-IN NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

The Dine-In program is open to older adults aged 60 years and older. Currently, we are serving hot meals Monday through Wednesday on a first-come first-serve basis. To participate, guest must complete an intake form, check-in opens at 10:30 am with meals served from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm or until food is available.

SEMINARS / SPECIAL EVENTS:

Senior Commission New Year's Breakfast

On Wednesday, January 4, 2023, the Walnut Senior Commission and Walnut Senior Center staff co-hosted the annual New Year's Breakfast. The event gave our senior residents an opportunity to meet the Senior Citizens Commission appointees and to increase awareness of what the Senior Citizens Commission role is in the City. In addition to this "meet and greet" format, the Senior Commission asked the LA County Sheriff's Department to speak on Senior Safety tips and scams to be aware of. Senior Commissioners and Senior Center staff prepared a delicious breakfast for the senior residents. A total of 50+ participants were in attendance.

OLDER ADULT CLASSES:

Heart and Soul Line Dance classes have been in full swing offering lessons twice a week. Monday classes are perfect for the working older adult and scheduled for 6pm. Thursday classes are perfect for the retired person, scheduled for the morning at 9:30 am. These classes are a perfect way to good heart health without the constant strain on joints and easy to follow. All levels are welcome and no partner is necessary.

TEEN CENTER:

Teens in 6th through 12th grades are able to enjoy activities including sports, crafts, board games, movies, air hockey, table tennis, foosball and pool. Homework assistance is available to those who wish. To date, we have over 300 participants enrolled in the Teen Center.

The Youth and Family Group Counseling program is conducted every Monday at 6:00 pm at the Walnut Senior Center.

In January 2023, The Teen Center offered Special Treats every Tuesday which included: Nachos, Confetti popcorn, cotton candy lemonade and ring in the Lunar New Year with the firecracker drink.

SPORTS LEAGUES & CLASSES:

Open Gym hours for Table Tennis, Badminton, and Basketball are available in the morning from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Walnut Gymnasium and volleyball on Tuesdays from 7:00 pm to 10:30 pm.

Walnut Youth Basketball (WYB) fall season continued practices and games through the month of January. The season will run through March 4, 2023 with games every Saturday. This season we will have 24 teams with the new addition to a Girls only team for Division 2 (3rd/4th). The WYB season is for children in grades K thru 8th. Staff is preparing for picture day on

February 11, 2023 and getting teams ready for the SCMAF SGV All-Star tournament in March where the City of Walnut will host cities from all of the San Gabriel Valley.

The Adult Basketball League (ABL) began its Winter/Spring season on January 25th & 26th with 16 teams participating on Wednesday night and Thursday night. Each night those 16 teams are separated into two divisions of 8 teams. Staff is planning for the Spring Sunday League that will start in March which will offer a 6'2 and under division as well as a 40 and older division.

A new class began in the winter session, 8 Multi-Sport class which is held Saturdays at Suzanne Park. This 8-week class will teach children ages 16 months to 7 years old a new sport each week. Some of the sports the participants will learn a basics of are soccer, hockey, volleyball, and golf to name a few.

The extended pickleball pilot program is taking place until the end of the calendar year to allow for City staff to look into options for a permanent court. The court at Walnut Ranch is slated for pickleball play seven days a week. Staff has been seeing more consistency on the weekends with community members learning and playing pick-up games of pickleball.

BACKGROUND:

Dr. Ike Kerhulas, representing Serenity Infant Care Homes, Inc., has requested the use of Walnut Ranch Park on Saturday, May 20, 2023 from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 21, 2023 from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. to conduct a charity soccer tournament. The applicant has indicated that approximately 300 persons are anticipated to attend the event. Serenity Infant Care homes, Inc. has historically been approved for this event and has complied with all rules and regulations.

ANALYSIS:

Serenity Infant Care Homes, Inc. is a non-resident organization that serves the City of Walnut. Many families in Walnut care for foster children from Serenity Infant Care in their homes. Staff has reviewed the application and found that it meets the requirements for use of the fields and facilities.
