RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission receive and file the Parks and Maintenance Report for June and July 2024.

BACKGROUND:

This report is prepared and provided for the Parks and Recreation Commission for review and information on the current status of the maintenance and operations of the City of Walnut's Park system.

The Public Works Department manages general park maintenance at all City parks. General maintenance is performed largely by a landscape maintenance contractor and some by the City staff. The general maintenance includes mowing, edging, hedging, pruning of shrubs and trees, as well as the monitoring of rodents and pests. It also includes irrigation audits and playground inspections. Restroom maintenance services are provided by the custodial contractor. Park restrooms are open and maintained seven days a week, with the exception of two holidays per year (Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

City parks with sports fields are maintained at an optimum level through the services of sports field specialists. City staff augments the maintenance services through regular inspections and audits of the fields.

City maintenance staff also performs special projects in all parks including graffiti removal and playground equipment repairs. In order to conform to California playground standards, staff performs playground inspections on a weekly basis.

Additional maintenance activities for the division in June and July included the following:

Arroyo:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.
- Treated for gophers throughout the park.

Ashley:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.
- Installed 2 new benches.
- Welded on brackets for benches.

Butterfield:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.
- Cleared clogged toilet.
- Treated for gophers throughout the park.

Country Hollow:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.

Creekside:

- Cleared drain for the playground drinking fountain.
- Repaired toilet in the restroom.
- Treated for fire ants throughout the park.
- Treated for gophers throughout the park.

Heidelberg:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.

Lemon Creek:

- Repaired 4 walkway lights.
- Treated for rodents by the Adobe house.

Snow Creek:

- Repaired faucet in the restroom.
- Treated for gophers throughout the park.

Suzanne:

- Repaired a faucet in the restroom.
- Removed & replaced a damaged electrical box and receptacles near the horse bldg.
- Installed new conduit, wires & boxes for the light outside the gazebo restroom.
- Treated for gophers during the month.
- Treated for graffiti during the month.

Walnut Hills:

- Conducted weekly inspections of the park.

Walnut Ranch:

- Treated for gophers throughout the park.
- Rekeyed the New AYSO storage door.
- Treated for rodents around the building.

SENIOR PROGRAMS:

SENIOR DINE-IN NUTRITION LUNCH PROGRAM

The Senior Dine-In Nutrition program is open to seniors 60 years and older. Since the start of May, hot meals are being served Monday through Friday, on a first-come first-serve basis. To participate in this program guests must complete a YWCA intake form, check-in begins at 10:30 a.m. with meals served from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. or until food is available.

SOCIAL CONNECTIONS

The City of Walnut Senior Center is now partnering with the Los Angeles County of Mental Health Department on Mondays from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm to offer a one-hour support group for seniors allowing individuals to come together around a common activity to develop social connections. Here seniors are able to come and socialize, play games, share their stories, and explore different topics with the Department Staff and their fellow peers.

OLDER ADULT CLASSES

The City of Walnut Senior Center partners with the Mt San Antonio College Continuing Education Division to offer classes for older adults. Classes are designed and developed to meet the educational needs of older adults. Classes offered are Digital Photography, Creative Computing, PowerPoint Basics, Mobile Technology, Oil Painting, Home Gardening, Jewelry Production & Design, Healthy Aging, Principles of Posture and Flexibility.

Heart and Soul Line Dance classes started offering lessons twice a week. Monday classes are perfect for the working older adult and scheduled for 6:00 pm. Thursday classes are perfect for the retired person, scheduled for the morning at 9:30 am. These classes are a perfect way to good heart health without the constant strain on joints and easy to follow. All levels are welcome and no partner is necessary.

Zumba Gold classes are offered at the Senior Center on Mondays from 12:30 pm to 1:30 pm. Zumba Gold is a lower impact dance class designed with seniors in mind. This fun and social class will teach different types of Latin and international dances. This class provides simple to follow Zumba choreography that promotes balance, range of motion, posture strengthening and coordination.

Tai Chi Classes are offered on Thursdays from 11:00 am to 12:30 pm. Tai chi is a low impact exercise activity which is practiced as a slow-moving meditation. A former ancient martial art is now practiced for health and wellbeing. Benefits of Tai Chi include stress reduction, relaxation, improved mobility, balance and focus.

Young at Heart. The City of Walnut has partnered with Independence at Home and the Young at Heart Healthy Aging Association to offer a 32-week program that can improve upper and lower body strength, balance, reduce stress, improve mental health, and reduce the risk of falling. The class is full with 21 participants.

GROW GROUP COUNSELING

The Senior Group GROW Group Counseling program has continued to be in person, since the transition of the virtual forum. GROW meets the first Friday of every month from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Participants ages 55 and older are welcome and encouraged to learn new skills that will allow them to GROW.



TEEN CENTER:

The Teen Center is open from 12:30 pm to 6:00 pm for teens in 6th through 12th grades for the summer break. They are able to enjoy activities including sports, crafts, board games, movies, air hockey, table tennis, foosball and pool.

The Teen Center attended the 3-day registration expo at Suzanne Middle School to promote and register students for our Teen Center. Information and suggested tours of the Teen Center were offered to parents and teens. 75 members were registered within the three days.



Youth and Family Group Counseling

This program is conducted every Monday at 6:00 pm at the Walnut Senior Center.

SPORTS LEAGUES & CLASSES:

Open Gym hours for Table Tennis, Badminton, and Basketball are available in the morning from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm at the Walnut Gymnasium and volleyball on Tuesdays from 7:00 pm to 10:30 pm.

Uptempo Basketball Academy will be hosting three camps in June, July, and August. The first camp, held June 10 – 1 camp hosted 34 participants. The second camp was held July 8 - 11 and hosted 45 participants. Their last camp was held August 5 -8 and hosted 66 participants. The camp runs Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm and participants were engaged in multiple skill learning drills and scrimmage games on a daily basis.



Walnut Youth Basketball (WYB)

Practices for the summer league started in June, with teams practicing once a week for an hour. The Summer WYB season will be a six-week coed league with 22 teams ranging in players aged 5 to 14 years of age. Games will be held on Saturdays and began on July 6 and will end on August 10. Staff is preparing for the Winter season that will begin in December.



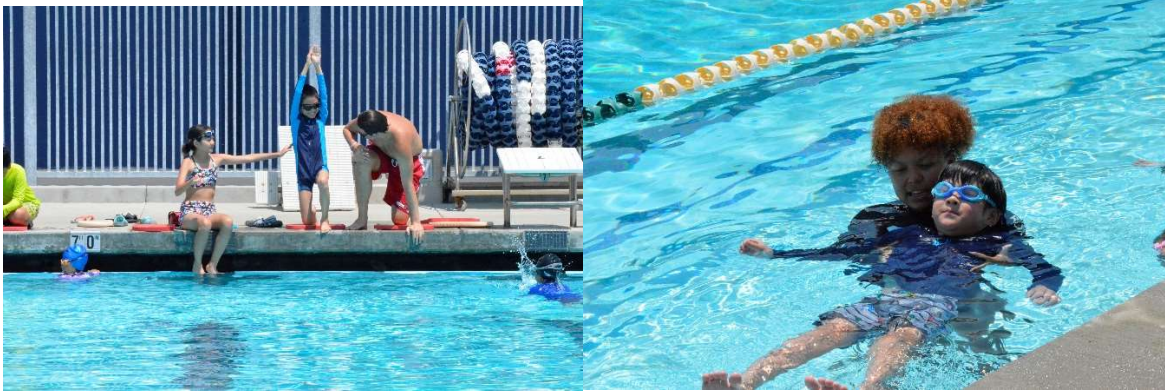
THE ADULT BASKETBALL LEAGUE (ABL)

The Summer ABL league began in June. Due to the number of teams the league will only be on Wednesdays and the season will conclude on September 4.

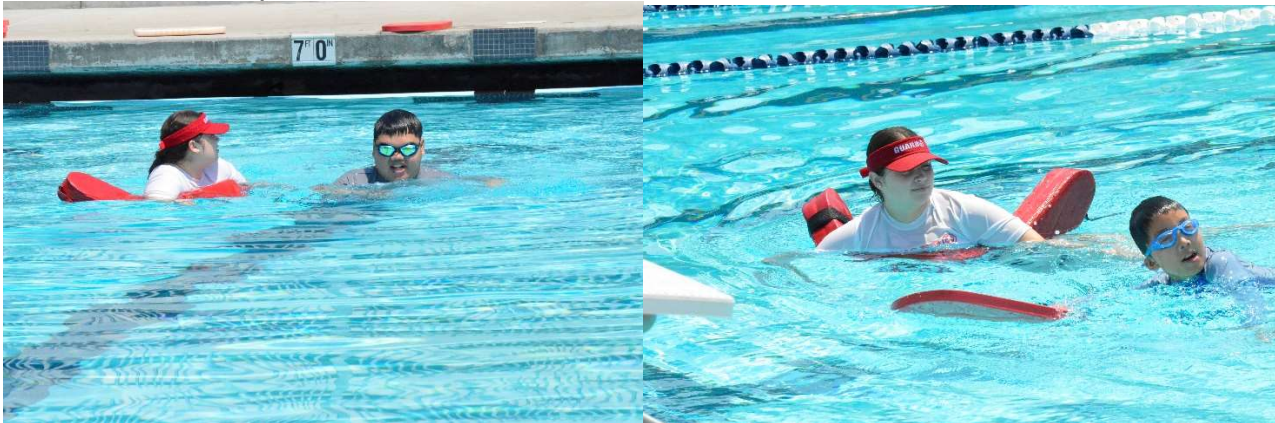
AQUATICS

The Walnut Valley Unified School District allocated time at the Walnut High School pool this summer. While this time is truncated from prior years, it most importantly permits the City to offer Tiny Tots, all swim levels (1 – 4), adaptive lessons through the B.E.S.T.I.E’s Program and adult lap swim. Current staffing levels also work well with the allotted time. Group and B.E.S.T.I.E’s adaptive swim classes began June 3 with classes starting at 9:15 am and running approximately 30 minutes throughout the morning concluding by 12:45 pm. The Aquatics program will run for 8 weeks and will also have lap swim for adults.

The Recreation Division Sharks Swim Team began their Summer Team practices on June 3. The team practices Monday through Friday from 7:00 am to 9:00 am. The 47 member swim team will have competitions starting in July. They competed against Covina on July 22 and then cities from all over San Gabriel Valley at the SCMAF SGV meet on July 27. Those who participated in the SCMAF SGV meet will move on to the SCMAF Swim Championships on August 10 in Santa Claita where they will swim against cities from all over Southern California.



SUMMER CAMPS

Camp Crawdad - June

Camp Crawdad is scheduled at two parks, Suzanne Park and Lemon Creek Park. This summer we hosted two, four-week sessions. A nominal registration fee of \$120 per participant is required to assist with the cost of the program. Camp Crawdad meets Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at Lemon Creek Park (Mondays & Wednesdays) and Suzanne Park (Tuesdays and Thursdays).

Camp Movin' n' Groovin' (CMG)

Camp Movin' n' Groovin' (CMG) is back this summer to host ten weeks of fun programming. This camp is appropriate for youth ages 7 to 14 years. It includes an assortment of activities designed to get children “moving” as well as crafts, trips and snacks. In the month of June and July CMG was completely sold out with 40 campers each week. Parents can choose to have their children participate in Movin' All Day from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm for \$220 a week or In the Grove from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm for \$170 a week. Each session includes themed weeks such as; Wild West Summer; Up, Up and Away, We SEA Fun; Party Animals; and Fun in the Sun. 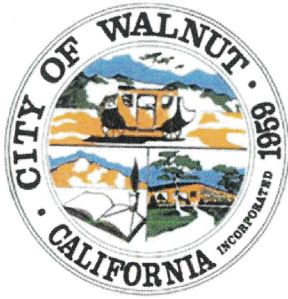

SUBJECT: Authorize DBWV-FC Man United to Host a Thanksgiving Tournament November 29 – December 1 at Walnut Ranch Park

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended by staff that the Parks and Recreation Commission:

1. Approve DBWV-FC Man United to host a Thanksgiving Tournament on November 29 through December 1, 2024, at Walnut Ranch Park as a third tournament for the season.
2. Acquire DBWV-FC Man United to obtain a day-porter for janitorial services through the City for an additional fee.
3. Authorize DBWV-FC Man to submit a detailed parking plan for the Walnut Ranch Parking lot for the duration of the tournament to be reviewed and approved by Staff.
4. Forward to City Council for review and final approval.

BACKGROUND:

The City's Athletic Field and Park Use Allocation Policy permits authorized sport user group to conduct two tournaments per calendar year. Within past years, the Parks and Recreation Commission and the City Council provided an exception to this policy for the Walnut Valley Pony Baseball (WVPB) Bronco Zone tournaments and Mustang World Series as well as American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO).

STAFF ANALYSIS:

DBWV-FC Man United is prepared to cooperate with all City requests in order to ensure its continued success in hosting tournaments in Walnut. Listed below are operational items that were reviewed and approved by both the Commission and City Council in previous years. Past tournaments ran smoothly without any negative incidents and cooperated with all City requests. DBWV-FC Man United will be subject to the same requirements for this tournament.

(a) Hours:

- ❖ Hours of operation shall be from 4:00 pm to 10:00 pm on weekdays and 8:00 am to 11:00 pm on weekends.
- ❖ DBWV-FC Man United will be responsible to schedule games with their best efforts to ensure that these hours are adhered to.
- ❖ In the unlikely event that a game or games extend beyond the 10:00 pm lights out policy, in the best interests of the tournament, DBWV-FC Man United will be permitted to complete the game(s) provided that NO amplification occurs beyond 10:00 pm.

(b) Parking:

- ❖ A Parking plan shall be submitted for review to indicate no parking signs within the red curb area.
- ❖ No personal vehicles of any kind will be permitted in the park at any time (minimal use of a truck to deliver snack bar items will be permitted ONLY prior to the start of play activity or at the conclusion of each day after participants have left the site).
- ❖ No minor, nor any unlicensed, uninsured adult, may operate any motorized cart, vehicle or other motorized/mobile equipment.

(c) Day-porter/Janitorial Services:

- ❖ A day-porter shall be utilized for janitorial services of the restrooms.
- ❖ The day-porter shall be obtained through the City at an additional fee.
