Silver 2 Silver is in action! We've collaborated with Metro to make your commute between El Monte Station and downtown Los Angeles easier, with lower fares, seamless service, and fewer restrictions. You can now ride for the new low fare of \$2.45. Seniors, persons with disabilities and Medicare cardholders can ride for \$1.15, without peak hour restrictions. That's right! We've done away with the peak and off-peak restrictions. Eligible discounted customers can ride the Foothill Transit Silver Streak for the new discounted fare 24/7.

Between El Monte Station and downtown Los Angeles, customers may use Metro and Foothill Transit passes interchangeably on both the Foothill Transit Silver Streak and Metro Silver Line. The Silver Streak 31-day pass can get you on the Foothill Transit Silver Streak and Metro Silver Line, between El Monte Station and downtown Los Angeles. The same goes for the Metro day pass; it can be used on the Metro Silver Line and on Foothill Transit's Silver Streak too! Customers using the Metro 7 day and 30 day passes will need to pay an upcharge of \$.95 cents on both the Foothill Transit Silver Streak and Metro Silver Line.

Local pass holders: take advantage of Silver 2 Silver by using your local 31-day passes. If you want to board the Foothill Transit Silver Streak or Metro Silver Line, you may use your Adult Local 31-Day pass and pay an upcharge of \$1.20. Also, eligible customers that use a Student Local 31-Day pass or Senior/Disabled/Medicare Local 31-Day pass can ride the Foothill Transit Silver Streak or Metro Silver Line, between El Monte Station and downtown Los Angeles, with no additional upcharges.



We're Going Back to School: Time to brush up on our student discounts

Tuition? Check. Books? Check. Supplies? Check. Transportation? Have you seen gas prices lately? Ouch! Oh and those parking fees, we can't forget about that. We know how expensive these times can get, and it may be even tougher this year for college students as tuition fees continue to rise. We can help! Foothill Transit connects to all of the major campuses throughout the San Gabriel and Pomona valleys, including the Claremont Colleges, Citrus College, Azusa Pacific University, Pasadena City

College, Mt. San Antonio College, Rio Hondo College, Cal Poly

Pomona, and Cal State L.A.!

Student 31-day Pass – Eligible students can get our discounted 31-Day Student Local bus pass for only \$33.

How? It's as easy as 1-2-3.

- Bring your student ID or any photo ID, along with a document stating your full-time student status at a local college.
- 2. Visit one of our five Transit Stores and fill out the application form.
- Take a picture for your new TAP card and load your new pass!

Viola! It's as simple as that! You're now ready to ride Foothill Transit.

Are you a student at Rio Hondo College or Pasadena City College? Well you're in luck! We have special partnerships with the two schools that offer even greater discounts.

Go Rio - If you're a Rio Hondo student, riding Foothill Transit can be FREE! The Go Rio program offers full-time students a semester long pass to ride Foothill Transit's local service. For more information, call 562-463-7268 or visit the website at riohondo.edu/gorio.

iPass - If you're a student at Pasadena City College, the iPass for you! This low-cost public transit pass allows full-time students to ride Foothill Transit local buses and Metro buses and rails. Biking with Foothill Transit!

By combining Foothill Transit with a bike ride, you can extend your pedal-powered range much further across the San Gabriel and Pomona Valleys, and downtown Los Angeles. Every bus on our fleet is equipped with bike racks on the front, capable of safely storing two bikes. It's a very handy way to haul your bike across town for any reason and the racks are easy to use! Take a look at this handy diagram.

We allow folded bikes to be brought aboard. If you've got one, simply fold it up and enjoy the ride. Store the folded bike below your seat or on your lap; be sure to keep it out of the aisle. Folding bikes should be collapsed before boarding the bus. Flammable-fueled bikes or scooters are not allowed on the bus or bike racks.
